"Honey Tickets" Procedures

A component of Agana Heights Elementary School's School-Wide PBIS Program

What is a *HoneyTicket*?

A **Honey Ticket** is an incentive for students to follow the School-Wide Behavioral Expectations. The purpose of the tickets is to promote positive interaction with students by every faculty and staff member. The **Honey Ticket** is much like a "Gotcha" ticket that is used to "catch students being good" except that we fittingly and lovingly named it, "**Honey Tickets**" to fit our school's Bumblebee mascot.

How do students earn Honey Tickets?

Faculty and staff members will get 12 Honey Tickets per week. They will give out the Honey Tickets throughout the school day to students they feel are following the School-Wide Behavioral Expectations (as per the Behavior Matrix). They must "catch" prospective students "being good". Students are discouraged from asking for Honey Tickets. They must be earned. ©

What do students do with *Honey Tickets*?

Students will deposit their **Honey Tickets** in their grade level's designated "Honey Pot" (there will be 1 Honey Pot per grade level).

What do students get for *Honey Tickets*?

Each Friday (or last day of the week) a designated faculty or staff member will pick 10 tickets from each grade level's Honey Pot. The students who are picked will have the chance to pick a reward from the Opportunity Hive.

Filling out a *Honey Ticket*:

Please write the students' name, homeroom, and grade level on the back of the tickets. Please ensure your handwriting is legible so that the individual pulling **Honey Tickets** will be able to easily read the students' name.

After completing a **Honey Ticket**:

Direct student to deposit his/her Honey Tickets in the Honey Pot.

Where do I get my *Honey Tickets*?

Honey tickets will be placed in your box every Monday (or beginning of the week).
